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How will the impact of pupil premium be measured? The gap will narrow significantly or close between pupil premium and non- pupil premium children in both internal and external data.	Why spending? All pupil premium spending is allocated depending on the data and areas which need to be addressed. This is decided on a year by year basis.
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Foundation Stage- Comparison of End of Reception Class Results from July 2016 and July 2017.

There has been a positive increase in the attainment of pupil premium pupils from 2016 and 2017 in Reading, Writing and Number and a significant narrowing the gap between pupil premium children and non-pupil premium children in all subjects. Overall, the Good Level of Development has narrowed by a solid 34%. *Please note: There were less than 5 Pupil Premium Children in Reception Class in 2016/2017.*

<p>In Year 1, the gap between pupil premium and non-pupil premium children closed significantly in Reading and Writing. The comparison from 2016 to 2017 for Pupil Premium children shows the attainment of children firmly increase in Reading and Writing.</p> <p>In Year 2 the gap between pupil premium and non-pupil premium children has also closed significantly in Reading and Maths for children achieving the Expected standard. The comparison from 2016 to 2017 for pupil premium children shows the attainment of children positively increases in Reading and Maths. At Greater Depth, the gap between pupil premium and non-pupil premium children has closed in Reading. The comparison from 2016 to 2017 for pupil premium children at Greater Depth shows no increase in attainment.</p> <p><i>Please note: There were less than 5 Pupil Premium Children in Key Stage 1 in 2016/2017.</i></p>
